## LIFE LINE

As young people, you may have older friends who you can turn to in times of troubles. But for those who have no such friends or are unable to turn to them because they are embarrassed, I wish to bring to your attention the organization called "Life Line". Life Line offers immediate help in time of trouble and there is no charge; help is as close as the telephone.

Life Line is based on the idea of Rev. Alan Walker, superintendent of the Central Methodist Mission in Sydney. Life Line is a 24 hour every day service to those in the community who are in need of help. He based his idea on the telephone because most of us have access to telephones which is the main medium for communication in our world today.

It was established in Sydney in 1965 and since then there has been a rapid development into an international movement over a period of 9 years.

In Australia, city after city has established Life Line centres both in capital cities and smaller provincial cities. However, the most dramatic development has not been in Australia but in other countries. Centres

begun in Canada, the U.S.A., New Zealand, South Africa, Taiwan, South Korea and most recently in Japan. This means that through Life Line international a "network of compassion" is offered through the telephone system.

This development seems to indicate that Life Line is an idea born for this age and it becomes part of a development in urban cultures around the world.

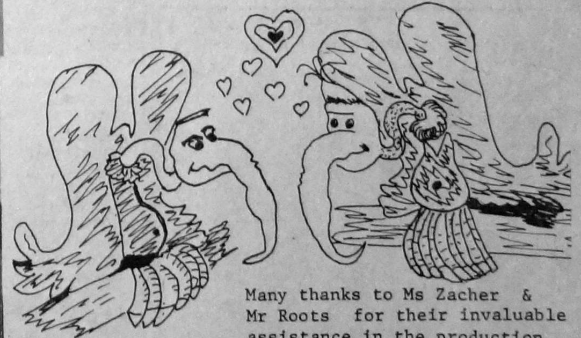
For during the last two decades there have been similar services established in many countries; in Europe, England, America and in Asia. This development had taken place because of the desperate need to offer something personal in societies that are becoming increasingly de-personalised. So where in most cities people who are in need of help are asked to wait for appointments, a Life Line service through the telephone offers ease of access at the time of trouble to someone who is responsive and prepared to listen and to understand the caller's distress.

Many have thought that "Life Line" is an important service in the city, but they will never need it. However, a turn of circumstances or some simple problem, compounded by others, has meant that the time has come when they've needed to call the emergency number. Not that this is a bad thing because Life Line is not set up simply for those who have great problems but also for those who are upset about things. One young person interviewed on a television programme after attempting suicide said; "I thought that I might call Life Line, but felt that there might be someone else who needed to talk to them more than I, so I didn't call them."

If you have a real problem don't hesitate to contact Life Line.

REMEMBER: "Help is as close as the telephone"  
The life you save may be your own.

**Fact or Fiction.**

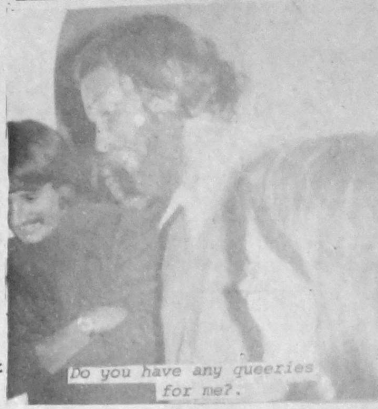
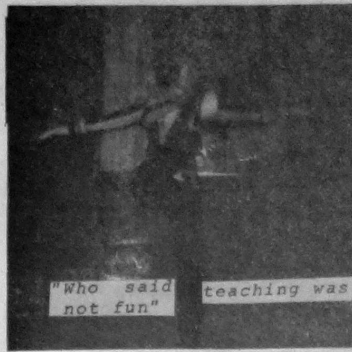
editorial

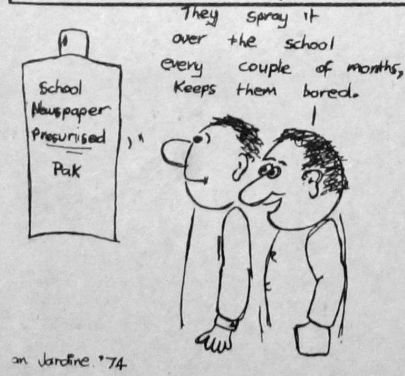
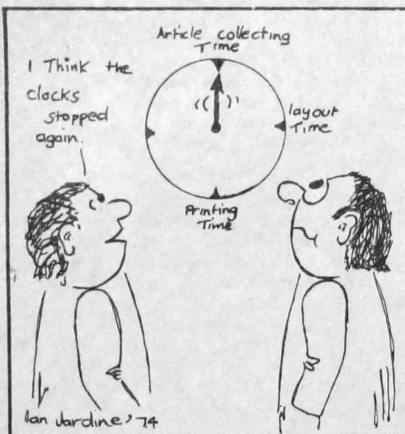
Next term the Matriculation students will be going on an English camp to Mirboo North With Moe, Newborough and Trafalgar High schools joining them for the four day seminar.

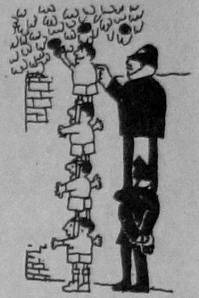
